- It is important that for sports such as football and hockey your children have the
 correct kit as these clubs will always take place outdoors (e.g., Football boots,
 shin pads, waterproof etc.)— Please ask Mrs James if you are unsure what your
 child needs.
- Ms Stansfield will oversee the smooth running of the clubs and ensure that children are passed over to parents/ carers at the end of the session. For all queries relating to Extra-Curricular Clubs please contact Ms Stansfield.
- All children attending Extra-Curricular Clubs should be collected from Class 1's door- on the playground.
- Please pick up your child promptly at **4.15pm after clubs.**
- Please make sure that you pay for clubs in advance. If this does not happen then your child will not be booked on the course.
- Please note that as we continue to receive the Sports Grant in the year 2023 /24
 we will continue to supplement the cost of the extra-curricular activities once

Family Communion

School Meals Increase

We have had notification from Lancashire County Council schools catering that the charge for school meals will be increasing from £2.50 to £2.70 from September 2024. They have made this increase to cover the increase in wages and rising food costs. Therefore, the cost to parents will change from the start of the new school year in September 2024 to £2.70.

Healthy Snacks Policy

As you are all aware, the Governing body have a policy that only fruit snacks are permitted in school for break times. We ask that you ensure that you continue to support this; the Governing Body made this decision because we have a number of children with allergies and we also promote 'Healthy Eating' in our school. If other snacks are sent in, they will be returned home.



Swimming

Swimming resumes this term for our year 3/4 children – starting after the Easter holiday – each Wednesday, lessons will take place during the first half of the morning before breaktime.

Children need the following

- Swimming Costume / Trunks (please note not swimming shorts as they hold too much water and not bikini's)
- Girls and boys with longer hair need a swimming hat (please put talc in this as it helps to get in on!)
- Towel
- Goggles (optional but require a signature on the consent form)

Mrs. James will also be contacting the Year 6 parents separately as there is a requirement that by the end of Y6 pupils can swim 25% and with COVID the older children did not get the full swimming allocation that they would normally receive in school. Parents will be asked whether their child can swim 25m and for those that can't we will take them for additional swimming lessons in the latter half of the summer term.

It is that time of year again pantomime season. The excitement is beginning to mount. Mrs. James is practicing her singing; Miss Kirby is devising dance routines and Mrs. Millward is dusting off her 'Directors Chair'

The auditions will take place before we break up for half term.

Please be aware that Mrs Millward, Miss Kirby and Mrs James put a massive amount of effort into the Pantomime and it is very frustrating when children with significant parts do not turn up to **both** evening performances. When this happens, it has implications for all the children in the show.

We will be running Panto practice every Tuesday after school from **Tuesday 21st May** from 3:15 – 4:15pm for all Year 6 pupils and any Year 5 pupils that play significant roles and there is an expectation that children attend these.

The Importance of good attendance



Attendance during one school year	Equals days absent	Which is approximately weeks absent	Which is this is the number of lessons missed
95%	9 days	2 weeks	50 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons
80%	38 days	8 weeks	200 lessons
70%	57 days	11.5 weeks	290 lessons



Your children get 14 weeks holiday a year!

There are 38 weeks in the year when schools are open, and 14 weeks (175 days) when families can visit family overseas; go on holiday; travel; pupils can work, take educational trips, attend non urgent medical appointments.....So is your request for leave exceptional?

When a Child Arrives Late:

- It interrupts concentration
- It wastes valuable learning time
- The teacher repeats information / instructions whilst others have to wait
- The late child is at an immediate disadvantage because they may have missed important teaching points, missed discussions where ideas are shared and will be generally unsettled
- Children feel stressed and anxious about having to walk into their lessons late, some children find being late very distressing.
- Please note school starts at 8:40 and the expectation is that all pupils enter school at this time.

A polite reminder about drop off and collecting on time before / after school and after clubs.

- Parents will drop off / collect children (or arrange for this to happen)
 punctually if parents are late then the children will be placed in Acorns Club and there will be a charge. Please note there is an expectation that you collect promptly at 3:15pm (or 4:15pm if your child participates in an extra curricular activity)
- Late drop off and collection in monitored by Miss Manns Family Learning Mentor

The Key Stage 2 tests are timetabled from Monday 13th May to Thursday 16th May 2024.

- Monday 13th May: English Grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) papers 1 (questions) and 2 (spelling)
- Tuesday 14th May: English reading paper.
- Wednesday 15th May: Mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)
- Thursday 16th May: Mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)
