# Is your request for leave exceptional?

Please note any application that claims to be an exceptional circumstance will require evidence







### When a Child Arrives Late:

- It interrupts concentration.
- It wastes valuable learning

- The teacher must repeat information and instructions, causing delays for other students.
- The late child is at an immediate disadvantage, potentially missing important teaching points and discussions, and feeling generally unsettled.
- Children may feel stressed and anxious about arriving late, which can be very distressing for some

# A Polite Reminder About Drop-Off and Collection Times:

- Parents are expected to drop off and collect their children (or arrange for this to happen) punctually. If parents are late, children will be placed in Acorns Club, and a charge will apply. Please ensure you collect your child promptly at 3:15 pm (or 4:15 pm if your child participates in an Extra-Curricular Club).
