Making connections	Year 1/2- Cycle B Unit 1.8: Joseph Why is Joseph a Bible hero? • explore one of the most well-known epic stories of the Old Testament. • help pupils to talk about the actions and feelings of the characters and relate them to their own experiences. • consider what we can learn from this story. • learn more about the nature and characteristics of God	N/A	EYFS 4: Christmas How do Christians Celebrate Jesus' birthday? • explore the nativity story in a variety of ways and ensure pupils know that Christmas is the celebration of Jesus' birth. EYFS 7: Easter Why do Christians believe that Easter is all about love? • explore the events of Easter through a variety of multisensory experiences ensuring that pupils know that for Christians it is a celebration of Jesus' death and resurrection. • enable pupils to begin to understand that Christians believe that Jesus died because he loves us and that he came back to life to save us and mend the relationship with God that was broken at the Fall. (God's Big Story) Year 1/2 – Cycle B Unit 1.5: Easter What do you think is the most important part of the Easter Story? • give children an opportunity to reflect upon the miracles of nature and new life during springtime. • for pupils to hear and be able to retell the Easter Story. • make links between the transformation of plants and animals and the Easter story in order to develop an understanding of the resurrection.
