

The reality is we have no idea who these people are that they are talking to, some say they live in different countries but more than that parents didn't know what their children were doing. This is such an important topic, we do lessons around keeping safe on line in school but that is not enough as it is at home where the children access the many different Apps and begin to connet with people on line
